



The book is a language learning read-aloud intended for families and educators of young children.

As they make their way home, they zoom through downtown where they run out of gas, oh no! But that doesn't stop them as they cleverly think of how to continue on their jubilant journey, whether it's hiking the mountains, swooping in a gondola, floating on a boat, or making their way on a pirate ship. They have many adventures along as Chris the bus driver is determined to get his charges home, no matter what! At last, the young zebras arrive home zonked out at their zoo sweet zoo.

This vibrant and whimsical story is a fun and silly read-aloud for the classroom and at home with its playful combination of alliteration with alphabet learning, using individual letters in rhythmic text across each spread. The book is set to be released on July 22, 2025.
